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## Guided tour of Kincardine Castle and Gardens

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## Afternoon activity options:

### Fishing on the River Dee

The River Dee is internationally famous for its salmon fishing, especially for its multi-sea winter spring salmon, with anglers coming from all over the world to fish. It has historically been thought of as the top spring Atlantic Salmon river in the world (Feb-May).

Spring salmon stocks have been rising steadily over the last few years, with the River Dee producing more highly prized spring salmon than any other river in the United Kingdom

### Crannach Bread Making Classes

They offer bread making courses, either a full or a half day. The full day course comprises making a Sourdough loaf, a Wholemeal bread using locally produced wheat and a Ciabatta, three styles of bread. In the afternoon, they make a Brioche and Fruit Buns, the aim to enable visitors to successfully add butter and eggs to a recipe. By days end, you will be able, to go home and create these or other recipes with confidence.

### Visit the Butterworth Gallery

Formerly the old village shop and post office, complete with old petrol pump and red telephone box, The Butterworth Gallery hosts a permanent display of original artwork by Howard Butterworth and his daughter Mary Louise. A surprising mix of traditional and contemporary, the gallery is run by Howard's eldest daughter Sarah and a warm and friendly welcome always awaits customers who come from all over the world, time and time again.

Situated on the scenic South Deeside Road (B976), halfway between Banchory and Aboyne on Royal Deeside, this unique gallery is an unexpected find in the middle of nowhere.
